PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

As winter approaches and the cooler weather sets in, it is important to remember to use prevention measures to keep our school community well. Please encourage your child/ren to wash hands regularly, particularly before eating; avoid touching eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands; cover nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing; and stay home if unwell.

Communication between families and schools is always in the best interest of student well-being and learning. If you are calling or emailing the school, you can expect to have a reply from staff within 2 business days. In some instances, this reply may just be letting you know that your correspondence has been received and more time is needed to investigate an incident. If this is not occurring, please contact either the Junior School Manager (Nick Egan), Senior School Manager (Melissa Loterzo), Assistant Principals, or myself. Staff too are entitled to their family time, and I would not expect them to be answering emails late at night or on weekends. The best results always come from respectful correspondence between parties.

If students need to leave early for medical or other appointments, I ask that parents please come into the General Office to sign their child out. Students are not able to sign themselves out using the Compass Kiosk. I thank you for your support with this.

Again, I remind all families that 'All Things Uniform' has a variety of warm uniform items for sale, including puffer jackets. There should be no hoodies or beanies other than BSC Uniform beanies. Leggings and grey tracksuit pants are not part of our school uniform. If a student is out of uniform for any reason, they must bring a note and obtain a uniform pass from the Senior School Office (S5) at the beginning of the day.

Jigsaw Cultural Expo 2023!



Lockers

All students are allocated a locker when they begin at Broadford Secondary College.

Students are also allocated a combination padlock to use during their time at the College. If by chance the lock will not open due to mechanical error we will replace it with another lock, but any lock that is damaged due to misuse or misadventure or is lost by the student will incur a \$15 replacement fee.

Students are also expected to remain in their allocated locker within their House area. Student Locker locations are also rotated on

Japanese sister school visit.

After a pause of 3 years, visitors from our sister school in Japan – Katsuta High School will be coming back to BSC in term 3. This will be the 29th year of our sister school relationship so it will be great to welcome them back.

What does a sister school visit involve?

20 students and 2 staff from Katsuta will visit us for 4 nights. **They arrive Saturday 29th July and will depart Wednesday morning on August 2nd.** The students range from year 9 to year 11. They will stay with host families in our school community for the 4 nights. They spend the weekend with the host family and come into school on Monday and Tuesday to take part in activities with BSC students.

What does a host family have to do?

You need to be able to provide accommodation for a Japanese student for 4 nights.

If you would like to host a Japanese student (or students) we ask you to have a current Working with Children Check. I will be asking for expressions of interest in upcoming newsletters and can assist anyone who needs help with this.

We will have profiles of all the students, so we can find out about dietary needs (or just what they like or don't like eating) as well as any necessary medical information, their hobbies and interests.

The students are here to practice their English. Though they may seem shy at first, they quickly develop in confidence as they get to practice their conversation skills with you.

You don't need to plan activities and trips. They are here to experience life with an Australian family – so your usual weekend activities are all fine. Supermarket shopping, weekend sports and activities at home are all part of the experience.

Some updates:

Over the next few weeks I will be holding some lunch time meetings for students who would like to find out more information about what is involved. Students and families are also welcome to email me at school. I will be handing out expression of interest forms for students to take home. I can also email these to interested families if that is easier.

V/line News

Reduced public transport fares for regional Victoria

On Friday 31 March 2023, the Department of Transport and Planning introduced lower regional public transport fares across Victoria, including on V/Line, local trains, buses and trams.

This means that weekday travel is capped at a daily fare of \$9.20 or \$4.60 for concession. For shorter regional trips, fares cost less. The daily fare to travel on Victoria's regional network on weekends and public holidays is now capped at \$6.70 or \$3.35 for concession. CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE

The conveyance allowance is a form of financial assistance to help families in rural and regional Victoria with the cost of transporting their children to their nearest appropriate school/campus. The conveyance allowance is available to eligible students travelling by public transport, private car and private bus. The conveyance allowance is also available to eligible students whose nearest school is not serviced by a free school bus.

Eligibility criteria:

The eligibility criteria varies depending on the type of school attended and where it is located.

Students attending a government or non-government school must:

- Attend their nearest government or non-government school/campus appropriate to their year level at which admission is permissible
- be enrolled at a school/campus outside Melbourne's metropolitan conveyance boundary
- reside 4.8km or more by the shortest practicable route from that school/campus attended
- be of school age (5 to 18 years old at time of application) and reside in Victoria.

Term 2 – 02 June 2023

Term 3 – 25 August 2023

Term 4 – 24 November 2023

HOW TO ACCESS PAT SCORES IN Compass Analytics

Twice a year, students in years 7 to 10, complete the Maths and Reading Progress Achievement Tests (PAT).


These tests allow teachers to identify student's strengths, and areas for improvement at the time of testing. Most importantly, they help track students' growth over time and allow students, parents, and

teachers, the opportunity to reflect on achievements. Each semester, students should aim to improve their PAT result by approximately 3 points.

These tests are just one way we measure progress. We also use classwork, SACs, NAPLAN, progress reports etc.
