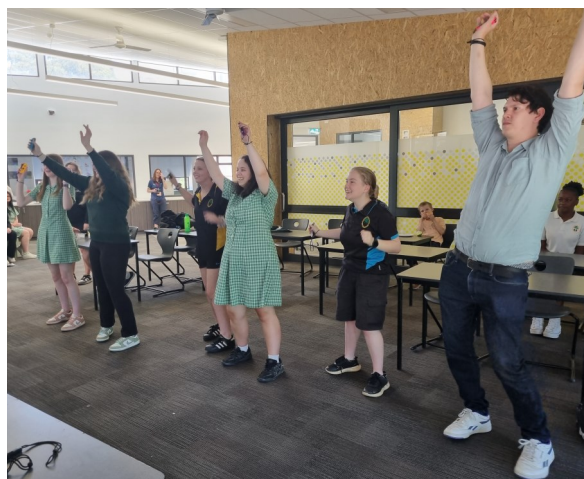
Just Dance Tournament

SCHOOL SAVING BONUS

The Victorian Government is providing a one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus for parents and carers of all Victorian government school students from Prep to Year 12 in 2025. This support will help cover the cost of school uniforms, textbooks, and school activities like camps, excursions and sports.

We have put together some information for you based on some of the questions we have been asked.

We will be running a Webex session for SSB to cover the information below on Tuesday 26th November at 6pm. Please use this link to join:

When will SSB be available?

26-28 November:

Parents/Carers receive email from Department of Education with SSB portal login information and code.

29 November and after:

SSB can be spent with suppliers or at school.

How will SSB be accessed?

An email will be sent out by Department of Education on the above dates to parents/carers of eligible students enrolled at school with a code and a link to the SSB system.

Funds will be accessed by logging into the SSB portal. There will be options for online vouchers, in store vouchers, or credit transfers to the school.

What can SSB be spent on?

The bonus can be used to pay for 2025 costs such as:

- Excursions, camps, or trips
- Sports
- Graduation
- School Uniforms
- Textbooks (*and some stationery if ordered with textbooks*)

Where can SSB be used?

SSB can be spent at approved suppliers or it can be used for school costs.

For BSC, those approved suppliers are:

- **All Things Uniform** (you can order NOW and choose to pay later with voucher)
- **Campion** (information sheet attached)

Orders must be placed directly with the suppliers using the SSB online or instore vouchers. The school is unable to place any orders on behalf of families.

The SSB can only be used at these suppliers or at the school. Funds can be used online, instore, or applied as a credit to the student account at school.

What happens if SSB is not all used?

Any balance remaining in SSB by 30 June 2025 will transfer to the student account at school and can be used for school activities or costs.

Unused funds will rollover to the next year if not used by end of Term 4. If a student leaves school, SSB will remain with the family if there is a sibling, it cannot be paid out. (*as with CSEF*).

What happens if I have trouble accessing the portal?

The portal is managed by the Department of Education, and the school will not be able to assist with any queries relating to accessing the portal or resetting codes. The Department will provide helpline information in their emails.

What happens if an email is not received by the 29th November?

Emails are sent by the Department to the primary contact on record at the school.

If you have not received an email by 29th November, please contact the school to check your details.

If your student is starting Year 7 in 2025 you may not receive an email until mid-December.

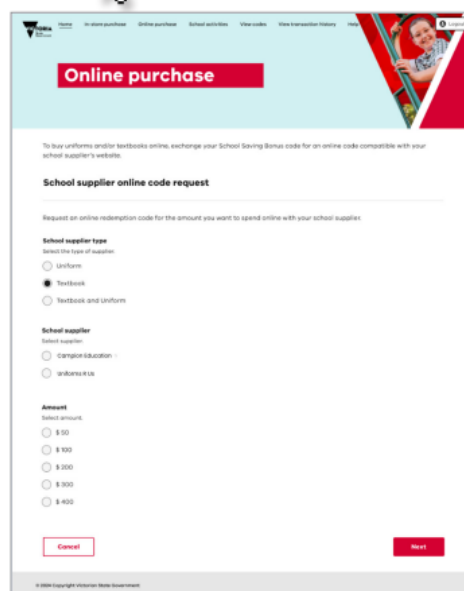
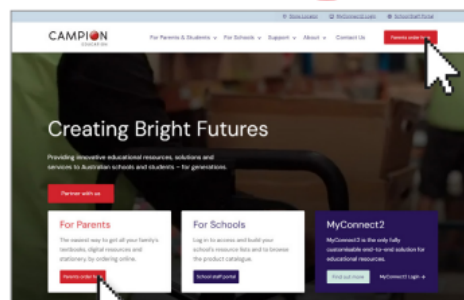

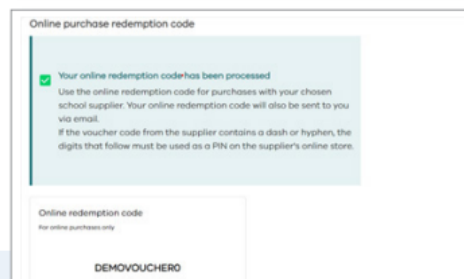
Online ordering with SSB

1. Head to www.campion.com.au and tap 'Parents order here'
2. Log in and follow the prompts to select the year level for your student. Select the resources you need
3. Complete your details, check the summary, and you will see the amount owing. You can pay using SSB, your credit or debit card or a mix of both
4. To use your SSB, refer to the Vic government email with SSB portal details:
 - Open a new browser window. Login to SSB portal and choose 'Online purchase'
 - Choose 'Textbook' then 'Campion Education'
 - Draw down a voucher for the amount of SSB you want to use (\$50, \$100, \$200, \$300, \$400)
 - Request your online code - it will appear on screen and be sent by email
 - Once you have your online code, head back to Campion ordering!
5. At the Campion payment screen, tap the blue SSB button. Follow the prompts to pay, confirm the order and you're done!



In-store shopping with SSB

1. To use your SSB, refer to the Vic government email with SSB portal details and your unique code
 - Login to SSB portal
 - Choose 'In-store purchase'
 - A Bonus code will appear in written and/or QR formats
2. Head to your local Campion store (details below) and let staff know you will be using SSB
3. You can pay using SSB, your credit or debit card, cash or a mix.

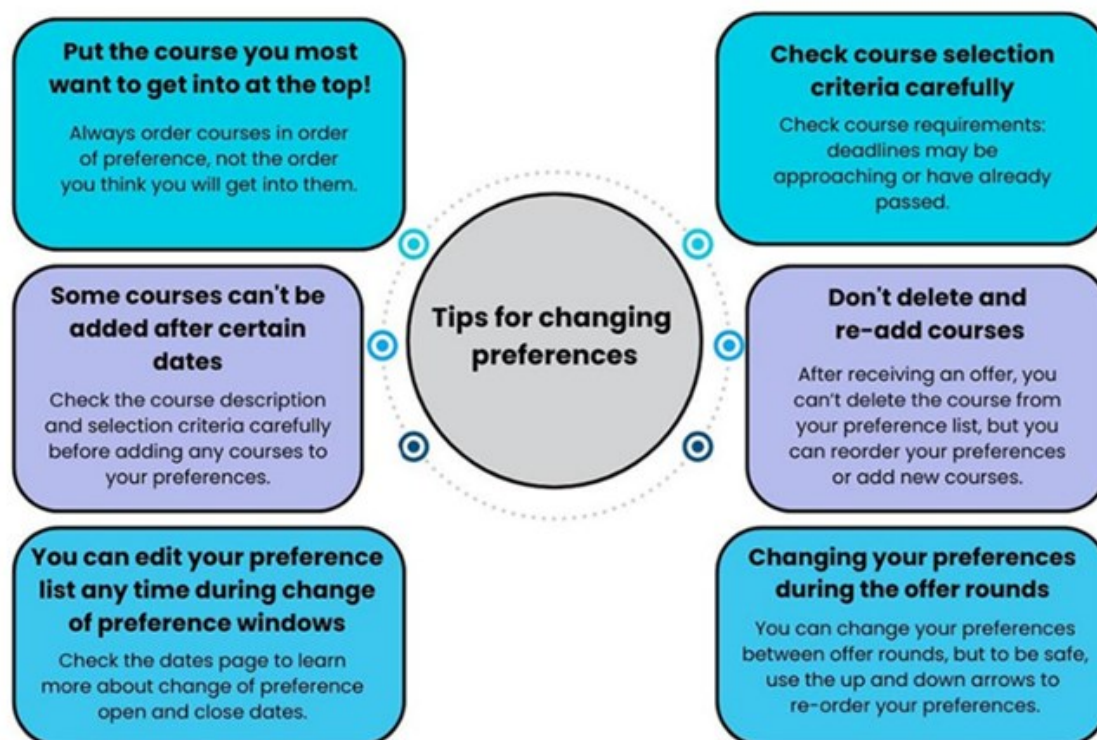
Change Of Preference

What is change of preference?

During specified periods you can add, remove or re-order the course preferences in your VTAC course application.

You may want to change your preferences if you have changed your mind about which course you most want to study, if a new course has become available and you would like to add it to your preference list, or if a course you had applied for has been cancelled and you want to replace it on your preferences list.

There is no cost involved in changing your preferences. As long as you have paid your course application processing fee, you can change your preferences as many times as you like within the specified periods.

If your results and ATAR are disappointing, it is important that you telephone me to make an appointment to come to school as soon as possible so that I can look at all of your options.

How do I access my results online?

You can access your results via the [VCE Results and ATAR Service](https://resultsandatar.vic.edu.au) website resultsandatar.vic.edu.au or the Results and ATAR app. The app is available from Google Play or the App Store.

You will need your VCAA student number and personal details to register. You will select a secure password when registering, which you will use to access your results on Thursday 12 December 2024.

Register early

You will need to register prior to results being released. Registration opens in July and we encourage you to complete registration by 5.00 pm Wednesday 11 December to ensure the fastest access to your VCE Results and ATAR when they are released.

You only need to register once. The password you create can then be used for both the internet service and mobile app.

Please note: your VTAC account is separate to your registration for the VCE Results and ATAR Service.

Offers are emailed to applicants on the day of release and available in the VTAC account from 2pm the same day (10am for the December round only)

Supplementary offers commence from February round 1 (applicants who have given permission and have not received an offer in a previous round may be eligible to receive a supplementary offer).

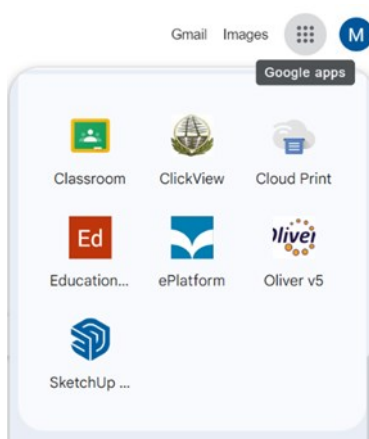
LIBRARY NEWS

The library has eBooks for students and staff to borrow 24/7, including the holidays.

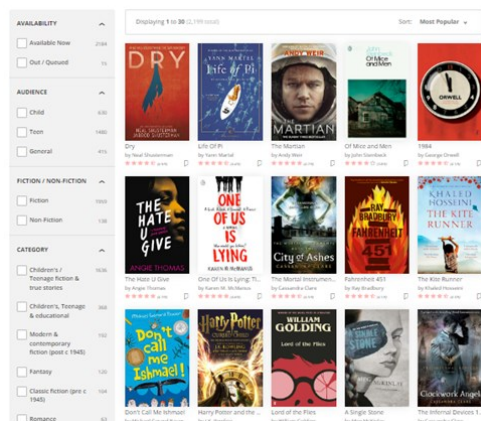

Uniform Expectations at BSC: A Guide for Families

At Bradford Secondary College, we take pride in maintaining a uniform standard that reflects our school values and fosters a sense of community.

To ensure clarity, here is a reminder of our uniform expectations, including what is and isn't acceptable for students to wear.

Approved School Uniform

Everyday Uniform:

- **Bottoms:** Plain black BSC pants, tracksuit pants, black flairs or black shorts (mid-thigh length).
- **Tops:** School white polo shirt or house polo shirt.
- **Outerwear:** Additional polar fleece, black windbreaker jacket, vest, or rugby top.
- **Accessories:** Black scarf, school beanie, school cap, or house bucket hat.
- **Footwear:** Enclosed runners or dress shoes.

Dresses/Skirts: School dress or skirt (plain black tights can be worn with the skirt).

Sports Uniform:

- School house polo shirt.
 - Plain black tracksuit pants (no stripes or logos).
 - Sports shorts.
 - Proper sports shoes.

Unacceptable Items

To maintain consistency, the following items are **not** permitted:

- Leggings of any type
 - Hoodies or hooded clothing of any kind.
 - Denim.
 - Slippers, Ugg boots
 - Crocs
 - Non-BSC hats or beanies.
 - Factory shoes or shoes of any colour other than black.
 - Long-sleeve coloured/branded jumpers.
 - Tights worn in place of pants, a dress, or shorts.

The Department of Education administers a number of scholarships available to eligible students who are enrolled in Grade 4 to Year 12 in 2024.

Applicants for these scholarships will be evaluated on their:

- participation in school activities
- community involvement
- academic achievement.

Scholarships are either one-off payments or cover the duration of the student's course or annual study.

CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE

The conveyance allowance is a form of financial assistance to help families in rural and regional Victoria with the cost of transporting their children to their nearest appropriate school/campus. The conveyance allowance is available to eligible students travelling by public transport, private car and private bus. The conveyance allowance is also available to eligible students whose nearest school is not serviced by a free school bus.

Eligibility criteria:

The eligibility criteria varies depending on the type of school attended and where it is located. Students attending a government or non-government school must:

- Attend their nearest government or non-government school/campus appropriate to their year level at which admission is permissible
- be enrolled at a school/campus outside Melbourne's metropolitan conveyance boundary
- reside 4.8km or more by the shortest practicable route from that school/campus attended
- be of school age (5 to 18 years old at time of application) and reside in Victoria.

In 2024, we strongly encourage students to own a 1:1 device that will accompany other essential learning materials each lesson. As a school, we are no longer recommending i-Pads for student use at BSC. Below you will find two school recommended devices that can be purchased through the JB-HIFI Parent Portal which is linked to our school.

Frequently Asked Questions

Is it compulsory for students to have a 1:1 device?

While it is not compulsory for students to have a 1:1 device, it is strongly recommended. With a 1:1 device, students will be able to access the full range of learning opportunities available to them at BSC.

Will students be using their devices in every subject, every day?

Each lesson is composed of a variety of learning activities, some that involve devices whilst others do not. Therefore at times there may be lessons where devices aren't used by students, however it is recommended that students bring their device to every lesson.

Where will students store their devices when it is not in use?

It is strongly recommended that students purchase a protective case to store and secure their device. Devices should be stored in student lockers during break times.

Can a student add their own software to their device?

Specific software required for each subject area can be purchased and installed at the discretion of the family.

Will my child be able to print at school?

Yes. Students will be able to print from school.

Is my child expected to take their device home every day?

Yes, students are expected to take their device to and from school each day.

What IT support is provided by the school?

The school will provide support to connect your child's device to the school network and basic troubleshooting. Any physical repairs to the device will be the responsibility of the family.

What about i-Pads?

As a school, we are no longer recommending students purchase i-pads as their 1:1 device. i-Pads restrict the use of a number of software platforms accessed by students at BSC, most notably the G-Suite. In our experience, students have expressed their preference to have a keyboard, particularly as writing demands increase from Year 7 to 12. Finally, i-Pads provide opportunity for greater distractions from learning as the school has limited ability to monitor inappropriate use of apps such as Snap Chat and various online games.

Can I recharge my device at school?

No. It is expected that students will bring their device to school each day, fully charged.

Can my child access games on their device?

Any games or applications are not to be accessed, used or downloaded via the school network unless instructed by school staff.

What happens if my child leaves their device at home?

It is expected that student devices will be at school everyday. Students who do not bring their device will be significantly disadvantaged as their ability to access lesson activities and materials will be compromised.

Will the device be covered by school insurance while it is being used at BSC?

No. It is the responsibility of families to insure their device if they choose to.

Does my home need internet access?

No. Students will be provided with access to the school network while at school, where they can access the information and basic software they require. If you do have internet access at home, you are welcome to connect the device to your internet connection.
